**François BOURGUIGNON**, is professor of economics at the Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales in Paris and the director of the Paris School of Economics. He is a specialist in the economics of development, public policy, income distribution and inequality. Prior to his current appointment, he held the position of Senior Vice President for Development Economics and Chief Economist at the World Bank from 2003 to 2007, where he provided intellectual leadership and direction to the Bank's overall development strategy and economic research agenda, at global, regional and country levels. Along his present duties as a researcher, professor and manager of a leading institution, François Bourguignon kept being active in the international development community by lecturing and writing reports for international agencies. Ever since his appointment in the World Bank and, in effect long before it, François Bourguignon had extensive practical experience as an advisor to international agencies and policy makers in developed and developing countries. In particular, he has been an advisor to many developing countries, the OECD, United Nations, European Commission, and was a member of the Council of Economic Advisors to the French Prime Minister from 1997 to 2002, a position he was recently re-appointed to.

**Jean-Pierre GUENGANT**, démographe, directeur de recherche à l'IRD, Ouagadougou. Titulaire d'une thèse de doctorat en économie du développement, il a aujourd'hui près de quarante ans d'expérience professionnelle. Il a travaillé dans la Caraïbe, en Afrique, au Nations Unies à New York, et avec le CRDI au Canada. Représentant de l'IRD au Niger de 1997 à 2003, il est représentant de l'IRD au Burkina Faso depuis 2003. Il est l'auteur de nombreux articles et ouvrages sur les migrations et la transition de la fécondité notamment dans les Caraïbes et en Afrique Subsaharienne.

**Sylvie LAMBERT**, économiste, directrice de recherche à l'INRA, professeur-associée à l'Ecole d'Economie de Paris, est spécialisée en micro-économie des ménages dans les pays en développement ; ses thèmes de recherche portent sur l'éducation, la nutrition et le travail des enfants, la mobilité sociale et les inégalités et les migrations internes.

**Alphonse L. MACDONALD**, specialist in research methodology and population and development, Former Senior Officer of the United Nations, New York and Geneva. Alphonse L. MacDonald, (Suriname), Doctor in Social Sciences, University of Nijmegen, the Netherlands. Worked as scientific officer at the Institute for Sociology of the University of Nijmegen; was Professor in Research methodology, Statistics and Development issues at the Pontificia Universidad del Perú (1967-1972) and adviser to the National Planning Institute of Peru (1972 – 1973); was senior demographer/statistician at the World Fertility Survey (WFS) (1974 – 1980). He worked for the United Nations in several technical positions at headquarters (Statistics Division and UNFPA) in New York, and representational positions in Latin America, Africa and Europe. He is a specialist in research methodology, social

statistics, and development planning with a strong interest in affect of climatological factors on individual and societal welfare.

**John F. MAY**, Lead Population Specialist, The World Bank, Washington Africa Region, Ph.D., is a lead demographer in the Africa Region at the World Bank. He has worked on many population projects around the world for UNFPA, UNICEF, USAID, The Futures Group International, and the IUSSP. He specializes in population and development, family planning, HIV/Aids modelling, and population policy and program design. He was a visiting scholar at the Population reference Bureau (PRB) in 1991-92 and again in 2006 and 2007. He is also an adjunct Assistant professor of demography at Georgetown University in Washington DC. He earned a BA in Modern History (1973) and a MA in Demography (1985) from the Catholic University of Louvain (Belgium), and a Doctorate in Demography (1996) from the University of Paris 5 Sorbonne.

**Rachel NUGENT**, is deputy director of global health at the Center for Global Development in Washington, DC. She heads CGD's Demographics and Development in the 21st Century Initiative, is director of the Population and Poverty Research Network, and conducts research on other global health topics. She has 25 years of experience as a development economist, managing and carrying out research and policy analysis in the fields of health, agriculture and the environment. Prior to joining CGD, Nugent worked at the Population Reference Bureau, the Fogarty International Center of the U.S. National Institutes of Health, and the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization. She also served as associate professor and chair of the economics department at Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, Washington. Rachel has a Ph.D. in economics from the George Washington University.
